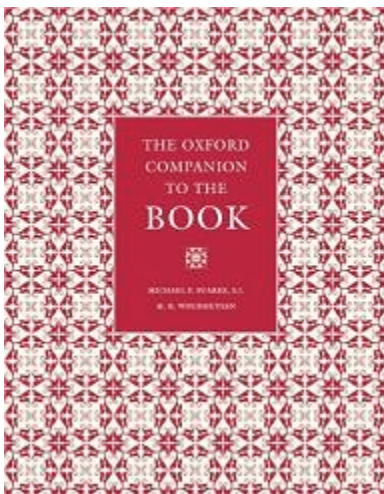
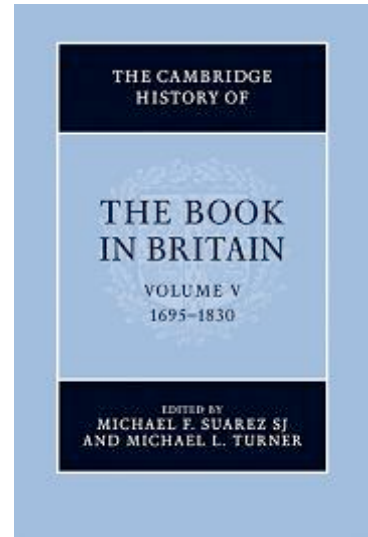


Rogers Notches Hat-trick...

DUNEDIN - Shef Rogers was recently able to celebrate the publication of several items in his forthcoming list.

For the handsome two-volume publication, *The Oxford Companion to the Book*, ed. Henry Woudhuysen and Michael Suarez, S. J. (Oxford University Press, 2010), Shef wrote the essay on "New Zealand," and also contributed seven short items on bibliographical subjects to the encyclopedic section of the work.

One of the latter pieces was an article about our own Dr. Keith Maslen, and at a recent Departmental morning tea, Shef was delighted to be able to present to Keith a copy of this work in which his contribution to the field of book history is honoured.



Cambridge University Press has just published the fifth volume, on the 18th C., of *The Cambridge History of the Book in Britain*, ed. Michael Suarez, S.J. and Michael Turner. Shef contributed an essay entitled, "Enlarging the Prospects of Happiness: Travel Reading and Travel Writing 1695-1830."

Shef also wrote the chapter on Alexander Pope in the edited collection, *Varieties of Mentoring Experience: Authority and Influence in Eighteenth-Century British Literature and Culture*, ed. Tony Lee (Ashgate), which was also published early this year. The editor of the book invited contributors to dedicate their essays to a scholarly mentor, and Shef dedicated his to Emeritus Professor Jocelyn Harris, who was also invited to the morning tea for the presentation.

As Shef has generously celebrated the scholarly work of our distinguished retired colleagues, we want to congratulate him on all these significant publications.
