3 FILL IN AND SIGN THE FORM

Please fill in all of the appropriate boxes. Need help? Contact details for the University Information Centre are below.

4 COLLECT REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION

- If you are enrolling at Otago for the first time you need to include evidence of your name, date of birth, and citizenship. A witnessed copy of your birth certificate, passport or citizenship document can be used as evidence. A copy of your driver's licence will not be accepted. If you need to order an original birth certificate, you should do so as soon as possible.
- If you have changed your name we need to see evidence of the name change. Check the *Guide to Enrolment* (page 10) or www.otago.ac.nz/study/enrolment/personaldetails for further information.
- An original or witnessed copy of your academic transcript (if you have previously been enrolled at another university).
- Evidence of English Language competence, if English is not your first language.
- Supporting documents if you are applying for Admission Ad Eundem Statum or Discretionary Entrance (see page 7).
- If you are a student from another country you must also provide witnessed copies of your residence permit or returning resident's visa or student visa or an original witnessed copy of a document issued by Immigration New Zealand confirming your citizenship and residency.

5 HAVE YOUR DOCUMENTS WITNESSED

Students should have their documents witnessed as true copies of originals by a Justice of the Peace or a Solicitor. You can also have them witnessed by: a Notary Public, a Court Registrar or Deputy Registrar, University Administrative or Liaison Staff, a Member of Parliament or a Land Transport New Zealand, Public Trust, or local authority employee authorised in terms of the Oaths and Declarations Act 1957.

Other officials or professionals should not normally be asked to witness documents. Students from remote areas who do not have access to anyone in the approved categories should contact the University Information Centre for advice (see contact details below).

Documents must be in English or be accompanied by an English translation.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

All students must be competent in the use and understanding of written and spoken English before being admitted to courses at the University of Otago. The minimum entry requirements described below form part of the matriculation requirements for admission to the University. Admission to some courses, however, will require higher levels of attainment.

If your first language is not English or Māori and you have gained your entrance qualification overseas you will need to supply certified results in one of the following:

For Undergraduate Study

- IELTS (International English Language Testing System) score of 6.0 in the academic module (with no individual band below 6.0)
- Paper-based TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) score of 550 (Test of Written English 4.5)
- Computer-based TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) score of 213 (Essay Rating 4.5)
- Cambridge Certificate in Advanced English (CAE) - grade B or higher
- Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency in English (CPE) - grade C or higher
- APIEL (Advanced Placement International English Language) Examination - grade 3 or higher
- Successful completion of University of Otago Foundation Studies Ltd's 'English for Undergraduate Academic Purposes' paper
- NZUEBS English mark of 46% or higher
- Eight NCEA Level 2 credits in English (four in reading and four in writing)

If your secondary education has been completed in New Zealand in or after 2004 and you are applying for entrance on the basis of Cambridge International Examinations (CIE) or International Baccalaureate (IB) results, you must have eight NCEA Level 2 passes in English (four in reading and four in writing) or grade E or better in AS English for CIE, or have the IB Diploma. You cannot use results from tests such as IELTS or TOEFL.

For Postgraduate Study

- IELTS (International English Language Testing System) score of 6.5 in the academic module (with no individual band below 6.0)
- Paper-based TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) score of 587 (Test of Written English 4.5)
- Computer-based TOEFL of 240 (Essay Rating 4.5)
- Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency in English (CPE) - grade B or higher
- APIEL (Advanced Placement International English Language) Examination - grade 4 or higher
- Successful completion of University of Otago Foundation Studies Ltd's 'English for Postgraduate Academic Purposes' paper
