Trajectories of Care at the End of Life in New Zealand

Heather McLeod, Visiting Professor, University of Auckland Friday 24th May 2019, 12.30-1.15pm

The success of the health system means people are living longer, but potentially also with longer and more complex trajectories at the end of life. This research, commissioned by the Ministry of Health, uses linked data to identify five trajectory groups. The utilisation of services and time spent in the community is explored in novel ways.
