Writing for Publication Workshop 6th December (9:30 am – 12 noon) with morning tea break 10:30 – 11 am.

Content

Spend a half-day working with a professional editor, [Ruth Fitzgerald](#) to demystify the process of 'getting into print' for the first time. Using a mix of group discussion, focused writing tasks and supportive peer review we will work collaboratively to find out how to transform your thesis chapter, great idea, conference paper or dissertation into a credible manuscript that is likely to be sent for external review.

Who is it for?

This workshop is designed for postgraduate students who are considering their first journal article or book chapter length submission to an academic press. The workshop will cover: choosing a publishing venue, defining the style, scoping the literature, the process of writing, creating the accompanying letter for your manuscript, handling the revision process, discussing authorship order, the values of sole authored versus writing collaborations and first versus second tier journals, expected sources of delay and frustrations, aggressive author pays online publishing versus more traditional scholarly sites. It will conclude by considering the value of developing writing communities from a workshop such as this for continued peer review and encouragement.
