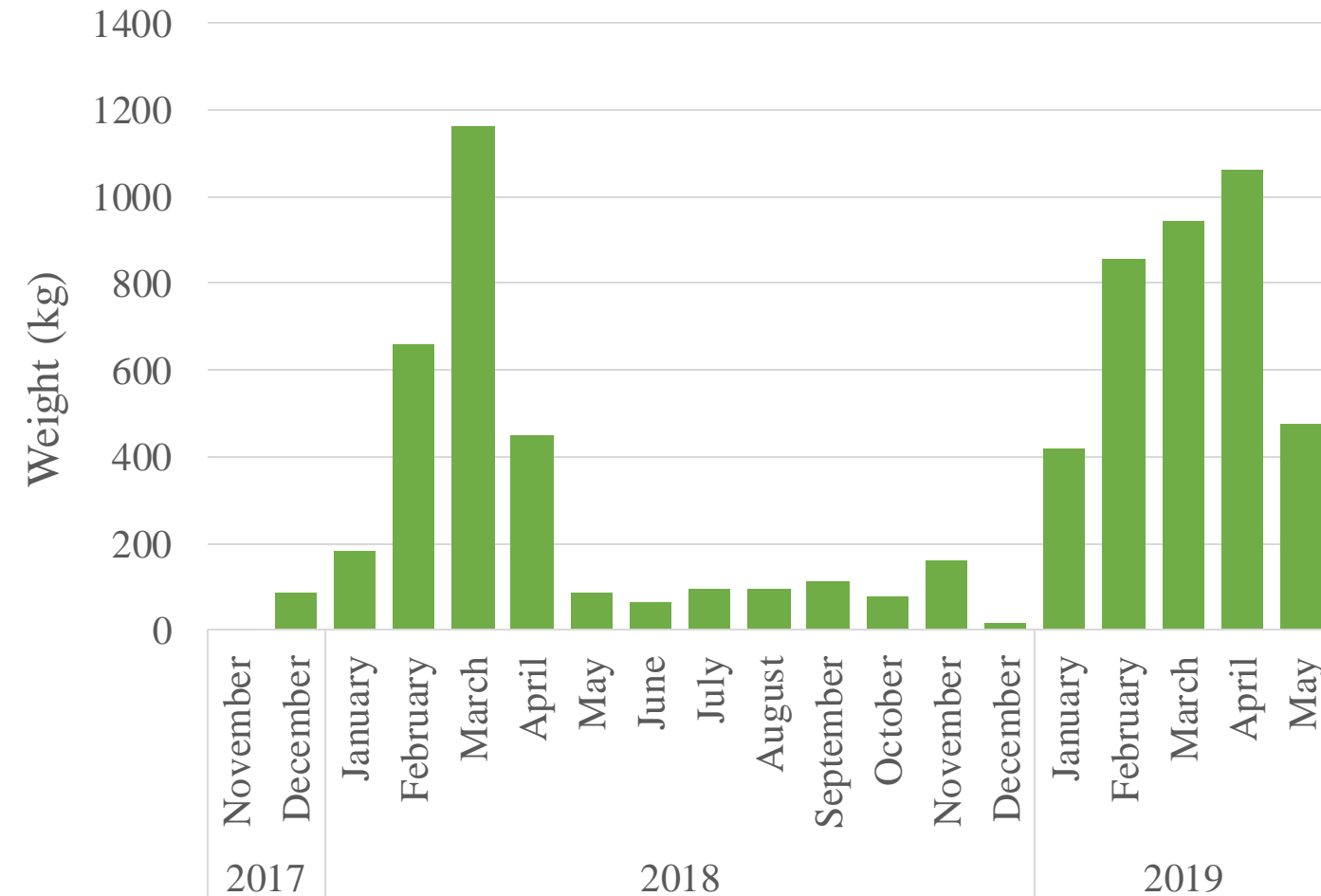

We have 11 local Urban Kai Farms

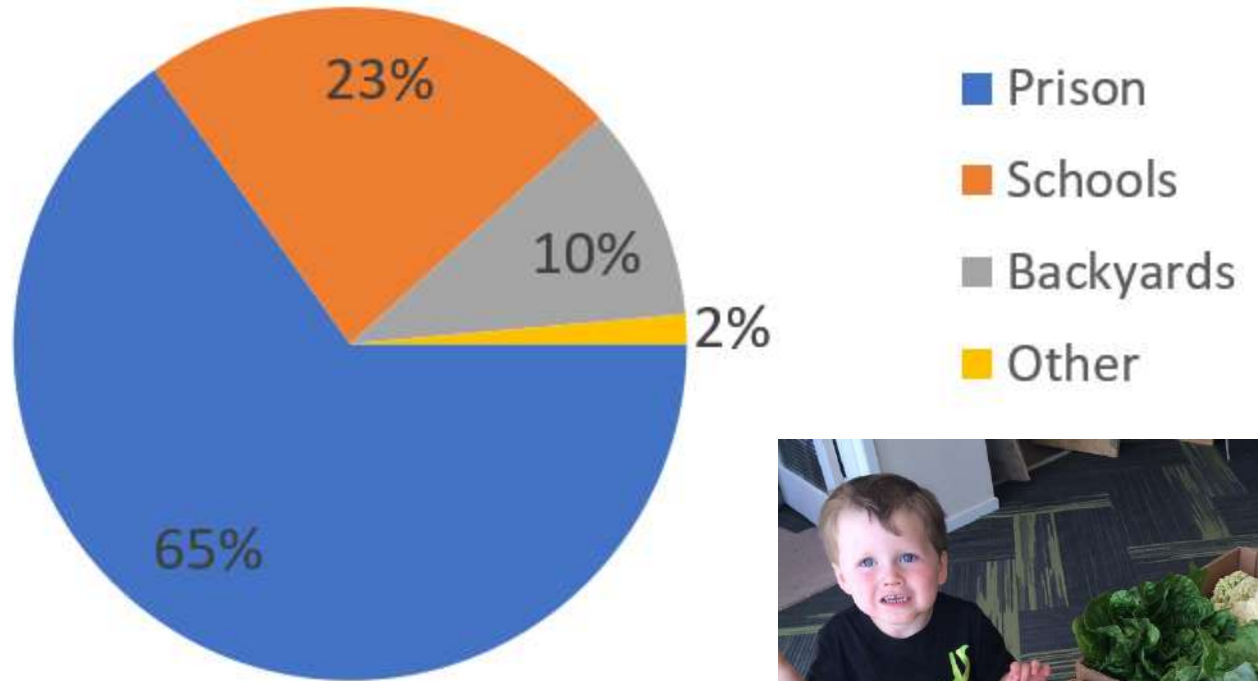
Urban Kai Farms:

Over 7,000 kg of produce has been harvested in the last 18 months

Urban Kai Farms:

During 2018, our farms absorbed nearly 35 tonnes of organic waste otherwise destined for landfill





Our off-grid commercial kitchen opened in October 2018.



Unity Kitchen:

We have been able to gift 6000 meals since October 2018
