

## Taking Notes from the Readings - Table

1. Introduction: What will the author talk about?	2. Intro/Main body: Provide an overview of the points the author makes.
3. Main body: Has the author used primary or secondary resources to illustrate their points?	4. Main body: Has the author provided evidence which DOES NOT support their discussion? (this will illustrate whether the article is balanced)

5. Main body: What is the author contributing to the wider discussion on this topic?

6. Conclusion: Has the author convinced you of their argument?
