# **Innovative Support through Covid Level Changes**

'Necessity is the mother of invention' and our team of 25 facilitators have been highly adaptive in 2021 delivering professional learning development throughout the ups and downs of Covid Levels to meet specific requests from communities.

Tailored support both online and in person is increasing as the needs of schools and kura have shifted due to changing needs in communities, for ākonga, whānau and staff. We are developing new and agile ways of working and always keen to co-construct and try new approaches to enhance quality teaching and learning in your setting.

## Deepening understanding of mathematics at Waitaki Valley School

Teachers at Waitaki Valley School have been working with PLD mathematics facilitator Viv Thompson to change, strengthen and enhance their teaching practice in mathematics. Viv has been working in the school since January 2020, and whilst there have been interruptions since that time, the teachers and leaders have willingly taken ideas on board and committed to changes that are producing positive results in student achievement and student attitude to mathematics learning.



Viv's work centres on building strong relationships with the teachers and leaders she works with, modelling effective practice in the classroom, co-teaching to mentor teachers and supporting effective pedagogy with relevant research.

The focus in mathematics has been to start with open-ended questions, located in contexts relevant to the cultural experiences of the learners, and allowing learners the space to talk about the question or problem, whilst the teacher waits and carefully listens to their conversation, perhaps inviting the learners to add on to what they are saying (Talk Moves). Teachers are often surprised by what learners already know. The conversations reveal the next steps for direct teaching, and for whom. Rather than having fixed maths groups, learners move into flexible groupings and workshop the aspects they need. The move away from fixed to flexible grouping has been liberating for many teachers, as they are responding to immediate needs, and learners are not 'stuck' in one group.

Viv has also worked with the teachers to introduce the Curriculum Progress Tools - Learning Progressions Framework, to deepen teachers' knowledge of mathematics progression and how to support learners to move towards the next signpost. Teachers report that the move to flexible grouping and having a deeper understanding of learner progression has lessened their workload, and allowed them to focus on the breadth of the mathematics curriculum.

## **Enhanced Induction Mentoring Programme (EIM)**

The enhanced induction and mentoring programme is a government-funded programme available free of charge to newly qualified teachers who had their initial teacher education practical experience impacted due to COVID-19. Aotearoa's seven universities collectively offer the programme to every early learning centre, school and kura.

University of Otago Education Support Services has mentors ready to support your newly qualified provisionally certificated teachers (PCTs) employed in Otago and Southland for 2022. The EIM mentor works 1:1 with the PCT and in collaboration with the school-based mentor to meet the specific needs of each individual and is available for all early learning, primary and secondary settings.
