# Faith in the Public Square



Public theology is about bringing fresh insights to bear on issues of current concern – issues like the economy, crime and punishment, community cohesion, climate change, international development and peace-making.

Public theology looks to go, not 'left' or 'right', but deeper. It seeks to raise the quality of public debates and sometimes even to reframe them.

#### The Centre:

- conducts research and contributes to public dialogue on a range of topical issues, and identifies issues for the future
- produces high-quality resources to promote critical and engaged thinking about faith and current issues
- works with churches, networks, agencies and other organisations committed to the common good
- facilitates constructive dialogue between representatives of differing or conflicting viewpoints on current issues.
