Spaces of Belonging: disability, belonging and wellbeing

"Spaces of Belonging" is a disabled-led qualitative research project, exploring disabled people's experiences of place and community, extending the inclusion conversation beyond mere physical presence. "Spaces of Belonging" explores political and identity struggles, exclusion and marginalisation of disabled people within everyday social, economic, and political places and spaces.





Dr Esther Woodbury is a graduate of the University of Otago Wellington, where she completed a PhD in Public Health on disability, mobility and social participation. Esther is a disability researcher, policy expert and activist. Dr Carey-Ann Morrison is a graduate of the University of Waikato, where she completed a PhD in feminist geography on gender, sexuality and home. Carey-Ann's research sits at the intersection of research and activism to challenge disabling structures and attitudes.
