Cancer care journeys and clinical decision-making: An exemplar of Māori-centred research

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New research methodologies and frameworks have arisen in response to concerns by Māori about how research is undertaken with Māori. For example, Māori have questioned whose research agenda is advanced when research involving Māori is undertaken by non-Māori. Māori-centred research, a term coined by distinguished Māori researchers including Tā Mason Durie, is an example which has evolved in response to such concerns.
