Kim Mulholland is the Professor of Child Health and Vaccinology at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine.

Professor Mulholland is an Australian paediatrician with extensive experience in clinical care, public health and field research in developing countries including Fiji, Vietnam, Timor Leste, Ethiopia, Cambodia and Gambia.

Professor Mulholland also shares his time with two Australian institutions, Menzies School of Health Research in Darwin and the Murdoch Children's Research Institute in Melbourne.
