



# Māori Bridging Scholarships

For intending postgraduate students

Division of Humanities

The Division of Humanities at the University of Otago is offering a number of Bridging Scholarships for Māori students in 2024. These awards are designed to encourage graduating Māori students to proceed to their first year of taught postgraduate study in Humanities.

#### SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

- \$10,000 plus tuition fee waiver for one year.

#### ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- 1) Applicants must be Māori students with a bachelor's degree who will be enrolling for their first year of taught postgraduate study in an honours, postgraduate diploma, or coursework master's qualification in Humanities that includes a research component of between 40 and 60 points, or an equivalent course of study, such as the first year of a two-year master's qualification.
- 2) Applicants must be enrolled for a full-time, part-time, on-campus or distance programme taught in the Division of Humanities.

- 4) Applicants must be New Zealand residents.

#### SELECTION PROCESS

- A selection panel will review all applications that are received by 4:30pm, on the closing date, and shortlist those to interview on FRIDAY 24 November.
- Interviews will comprise of a short presentation (five mins) by you on your research interest, three to four set questions and free exchange.
- Scholarship recipients will be selected and notified in writing by the Scholarships Office towards the end of December.

#### CONDITIONS OF ACCEPTANCE

- Successful recipients must agree to assist the Division of Humanities as required with student support initiatives and promotion.
- The Division of Humanities has the power to terminate or suspend a scholarship for any behaviour that brings the Division or University into disrepute, whether before or during the scholarship period.
