Dr Elizabeth Kerekere

Elizabeth will discuss the politics of takatāpui during these times of anti-LGBTIQ+ sentiment, resistance, and protest. She'll cover the history of Pride in New Zealand, recent challenges to Pride such as police marching in uniform, and the changes in the kaupapa of Pride over the years. She'll also discuss unmet takatāpui health needs, key political issues impacting LGBTIQ+ communities, and takatāpui activism.



Elizabeth Kerekere (Ngāti Oneone, Te Aitanga a Mahaki, Whānau a Kai, Rongowhakaata, Ngāi Tāmanuhiri) is the chair of the Tīwhanawhana Trust, and an activist in the LGBTIQ+ community. Her PhD looked at the development of takatāpui identity in the 21st Century.
