# Using evaluations to improve teaching and demonstrate quality

#### Overview:

The *University of Otago Strategic direction to 2020* states that excellence in teaching is a strategic imperative, and enhancing the quality of teaching is a high priority.

Evaluating teaching is the primary means of enhancing teaching quality, and similarly, the foundational purpose for evaluating teaching is enhancing and improving teaching and student learning. evaluation can be more effective for improving teaching and
