Regulating health and safety: evidence based programmes, occupational and public health outcomes.

Dr Kirsten Lovelock, Principal Advisor, WorkSafe

In this seminar Kirsten will focus on the role of the regulator and the need for evidence-driven approaches to health and safety in New Zealand workplaces. Drawing on a number of research projects, the seminar will highlight the utility of intervention and implementation science and the important intersection between public and occupational health for workers in high-risk roles.



Dr Kirsten Lovelock is an Honorary Senior Fellow, Dept of Public Health, University of Otago and a Principal Analyst, Research and Evaluation, Strategy and Performance at WorkSafe NZ. She is a medical anthropologist whose occupational health research has focused on the high risk sectors of agriculture, forestry and construction; and research on a range of front-line workers, including: those responding to natural disasters, working in the health sector, and providing care to the elderly.
