The Hard Worker, Class, and the Material and Symbolic Significance of Occupational Health Outcomes

This seminar draws on qualitative research that Kirsten has conducted with a range of workers over the last 30 years. The analysis of the face-to-face interview material and fieldwork is informed by Bourdieu, historical materialism, the concept of embodiment, and observational research on occupational psychosocial health and health outcomes.



Kirsten is a medical anthropologist who has a research interest in labour relations, environmental and occupational health in New Zealand. She has conducted both qualitative and quantitative research focusing on a range of New Zealand workers and published numerous journal articles in these fields.
