

As the year draws to a close, we continue to be grateful that down here in the South, we have kept COVID at bay. It has been a challenging year but we continue to look for silver linings and certainly opportunity to learn new skills has been one of those. We continue to grow our networks and share our knowledge and understandings whether virtually or *kanohi ki te kanohi*. Here at the Centre, we were fortunate that most of our planned activities took place. In February-March a group of Teacher-leaders took part in our Influential Teacher Leaders Course. This was an opportunity to explore what leadership might mean for ourselves and to unpack the skills many of us already have in terms of leading changes, understanding school culture, and developing people. Our primary AP/DP Network met in May. Around 30 school leaders attended and very much enjoyed hearing about Green Island school's experience with the Play is the Way programme (hosted by Aaron Warrington). In June, around 30 primary principals visited from Western Bay of Plenty and, co-facilitated with Dr Murray Fletcher, we explored what it means to *be* a leader in our unique settings. Unfortunately, due to COVID Level 2 restrictions, we were unable to meet in November for our network meeting but further days are planned in 2022 to build and strengthen our senior leader network. Developing Influential Teacher Leaders (Friday 25 February 2022 and Friday 25 March 2022)

Have you been thinking about leadership? This two-day course helps aspiring leaders make the transition from teacher to teacher-leader (e.g. teacher-in-charge/HOD/syndicate leader). A small in-school leadership investigation will be completed during the intervening weeks. Learning sessions focus on:

Re-Vitalising, Re-Calibrating, Re-Affirming Your Way of Leading: Re-turning to what really matters (Dates to be confirmed)

Focus: Those in leadership roles in centres and schools who are focused on growing their own understanding and practice of leading others.

Whāia te mātauranga hei oranga mō koutou.

Seek after learning for the sake of your wellbeing.

2021 has focused the spotlight on our ways of leading, that is leading others and also leading ourselves, as we navigate through what might be considered an unknown world and future.

We have learned that there needs to be a continued focus on well-being. This needs to have a focus that is holistic and has a sense of Hauroa (Te Whare Tapa Whā and Te Wheke are guides for us).

This research-informed professional learning focuses on the personal and relational capabilities that a leader possesses, nurtures and grows within themselves. This learning is based on the principles of whanaungatanga; leadership is unashamedly a relational way of Being and mannaakitanga; ensuring caring, compassion and kindness are at the heart of leading others.

The focus is on looking beyond the rational and cognitive capabilities that are required and explores the wider intelligences: the emotional, social, cultural and spiritual, in a focus on the person in the professional.

This professional learning focuses on the person and not the role; on one's authenticity and genuineness; on one's purpose and mission and on taking responsibility for one's own journey of growth.

CONSULTANCY SERVICES

The Centre offers leadership consultancy services to schools and early childhood centres.

Senior leadership teams in primary and intermediate schools

Dr Murray Fletcher facilitates tailored professional learning for leadership teams. These are conversation-based, school context-driven and evidence-informed sessions that take place over time (3/4 terms). Murray acts as listener, questioner, reflector and provider of resource material focused on growing aspects of collective and individual capability within a leadership team.

Senior leadership teams in secondary schools

Emeritus Professor Ross Notman is available to assist secondary leadership teams in undertaking a leadership stocktake: an evaluation of their leadership portfolios and group planning for future school directions. This half-day or whole-day facilitated discussion takes place offsite for uninterrupted reflection.
