This paper introduces the student to an overview of Travel Medicine and the underlying principles of preparing the intended traveller, including those that require special consideration (children, the elderly, pregnant women and immunosuppressed travellers). This includes accessing Travel Medicine resources to ensure that the practitioner remains up to date in this ever expanding and changing field of clinical medicine.

This paper builds on the introductory concepts covered in GENA713. The importance and prevention of non-intentional injury, safety and security issues during travel are explored. Specific clinical contexts to be covered include fitness to fly/ aviation medicine, food and water borne disease, preventing food and water borne disease, preventing insect borne disease, sexually transmitted infections, travel dermatology, and tuberculosis. Management of the unwell returning traveller or recent migrant is also covered.
