Scholarships for international tertiary students

Tertiary applications for the Manaaki New Zealand Scholarship Programme will open at midnight 1 March 2026 and close at midday on 31 March 2026.

Follow the steps outlined below to apply for a tertiary scholarship in New Zealand.



1. Check Eligible Countries

Manaaki New Zealand Scholarships are only available to citizens from the eligible regions and countries, outlined below.



2. Check eligibility criteria

To apply for a scholarship, you must meet all of the eligibility criteria. Complete the online questionnaire linked below to...



3. Study subjects

There are subjects we strongly recommend based on your country's social and economic needs.



4. Research available courses

Scholars can study abroad in New Zealand at one of eight universities or three institutes of technology. Citizens from eligible...



5. How to apply for a scholarship

6. How we select scholars

Distinct processes: Manaaki Scholarship Application vs. University of Otago Admission Offer

Phase One (1st – 31st March):

Apply for a Manaaki New Zealand Scholarship

- Online application at: www.nzscholarships.govt.nz
 - Applicants need to choose preferred Universities and study subject/ programme at this stage.
 - Choose Otago as your FIRST CHOICE of preference in your scholarship application.
-
- Your application will go through a screening process.
 - If you are shortlisted, you will be invited to an interview (around May-Aug)
-
- If you are confirmed as a preferred candidate, you are first in line for a Manaaki New Zealand Scholarship.
 - To take up a scholarship, preferred candidates must successfully apply for admission to a NZ university.

PhD applicants can contact their supervisors earlier in the process. Prior to the interview, PhD applicants: must provide evidence that they have a PhD supervisor or are close to confirming a PhD supervisor.

Phase Two: Secure an admission offer at Otago

Apply for University of Otago admission: www.otago.ac.nz

- ❖ The entire application, screening and selection processes are overseen by the NZ government (*it can take six to ten months from the time scholarship applications close*).
- ❖ The University of Otago provides the NZ government with a list of subjects/ programmes/ degrees that align with the subjects prioritised by Manaaki NZ Scholarships for your country.

- ❖ Managed by University of Otago (*with consultation from the Manaaki Scholarships team*)

Tips for your application



Apply for the Manaaki NZ Scholarship first

- It's crucial to choose an Otago major that aligns with Manaaki's recommended subjects.
- The course structures/ course outlines on Otago's website provides further insights on:
 - How Otago programmes can help solve your country's social and economic problems
 - The skills and knowledge you would gain from your studies at Otago.



Apply for admission at Otago after you are confirmed as a Manaaki preferred candidate

- We have a dedicated team to process your admission application.
- There are cases where candidates will need consultation of bridging programmes etc



PhD candidates

- Start securing your supervisor(s) before being confirmed as a Manaaki preferred candidate
- Read their profiles and research
- Customise your emails and application documents
- Tell them that you are applying for Manaaki NZ Scholarships

Undergraduate Entrance Requirements



These will vary depending on the country you come from, e.g: National High School Certificate

International Qualifications:

- IB Diploma with a minimum 24 or more
- GCE 'A' levels top three subjects = at least 8
- Approved Foundation Studies Certificates

**** Unconditional offers to be issued for predicted grades that meet entry requirements (A-Levels: BBB/ 12; IB: 29)*

- ❖ IELTS Academic 6.0 overall (no band below 5.5) – one skill retake is accepted
- ❖ TOEFL iBT 80 overall (writing 20)
- ❖ Other accepted tests: PTE, LanguageCert, NZCEL, etc
- ❖ A-Levels and IB: EL tests are not required if English subjects are included in the curriculum (A-levels: E; IB: 4 or above)

Note:

- Bachelor of Social Work: IELTS Academic 7.0 overall (no band below 7.0)
- Bachelor of Teaching: must meet the language competency requirements of the Teaching Council of Aotearoa New Zealand
