Professor Angus Dawson

Angus Dawson (PhD) was recently appointed as Professor of Bioethics and Director of the Centre for Values, Ethics and the Law in Medicine (VELiM) at the University of Sydney, Australia. He was previously at the University of Birmingham, UK. His background is in philosophy, but he has specialised in teaching ethics to health care professionals and medical students for over fifteen years. His main research interests are in public health ethics, research ethics and the relationship between empirical evidence and moral arguments. He was joint founder and is joint Editor-in-Chief of the journal *Public Health Ethics* and a member of a number of other journal advisory boards including those of *Bioethics*, the *Journal of Applied Philosophy* and the *Monash Bioethics Review*.
