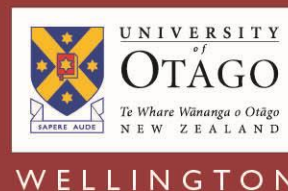

Meeting children’s rights now: What the UN Committee on the Rights of the Child said to New Zealand

In October the UN Committee’s Concluding Observations highlighted long-term problems with New Zealand’s lack of compliance with the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child. The Committee’s wide-ranging recommendations provide a path for redressing underlying and enduring disparities by advocating for a child rights framework to guide policy development and practice.

Action for Children and Youth Aotearoa (ACYA) is the coalition of NGOs mandated to produce and present the civil society report to the UN Committee on the Rights of the Child. ACYA leaders will outline what ACYA did and discuss what the Committee said.
