

# Following the Kororā

*Little penguin (Eudyptula minor) foraging ecology and habitat use as a tool for marine management*



## QUESTION

How do kororā use marine habitats, and what does this mean for marine spatial management?

## WHY

- Kororā can tell us about changes in their marine ecosystem; however, their behaviours at sea remain largely a mystery in many areas
- Identifying their foraging hotspots helps guide effective protection and management

## HOW

- Adult kororā are tracked during their breeding season using GPS dive data loggers
- These data will reveal where they forage and which habitats they use at sea

## DIVE CHAMPIONS!

*Eudyptula* means “good little diver,” and kororā can dive up to 2,000 times a day in pursuit of prey!
