Workplace health and safety and Junior Doctors: Have lessons learnt at the cost of lives been retained?

By looking at work conditions for junior doctors as a case study, Hazel will explore the extent to which the lessons from Pike River have been retained. The seminar will outline the findings of the Independent Taskforce on Workplace Health and Safety, and the response of government and unions to the report. The Taskforce was set up in 2012 to evaluate whether the workplace health and safety system in New Zealand was fit for purpose, prompted by New Zealand's poor health and safety record, including the loss of 29 lives at Pike River in 2010.
