Institutional Racism

Institutional racism is a legal implicitly supported colonial tenant that helps bury indigenous peoples and people of colour the world over. Its place is firmly rooted within New Zealands' health system and can be evidenced across the cancer continuum. Its concealment enables the reduction of more than just Māori bodies. To insult our brown bodies is to insult our intelligence and our connection to our whenua and our whakapapa.

A claim against the Crown for systematic racism against Māori and the privileging of non-Māori/non-Pacific adults in the cancer continuum

Rights based assertion
