1. Schedule

The Conference will begin at 1pm on Friday the 3rd and will be held in room 6N4 of the Richardson Building on the Otago University Campus. (See below for directions). In order to facilitate swift changeovers in a tight programme we ask that everyone: 1) observes conference etiquette and prepares papers as close to 20 minutes as possible and 2) recommend that you test your technology prior to the start of the conference. Richardson 6N4 will be open between 10 and 12 on the Friday for this purpose. The room is equipped with a MAC computer. You can also buy lunch at a variety of places on campus or nearby.

2. Directions to Richardson 6N4

The Richardson building is labeled 'F5' on the campus map and also houses the Law Department (59 on the map). The easiest way to access us is to find the Otago Museum (on Cumberland St) and then cross Cumberland at the pedestrian crossing and access the campus near F4 (61) the OUSA building. Then just walk across the green and the Richardson building is straight in front of you. 6N4 is on the sixth floor, North corridor (the right hand one).
