Women in Hydro Summer Experiences

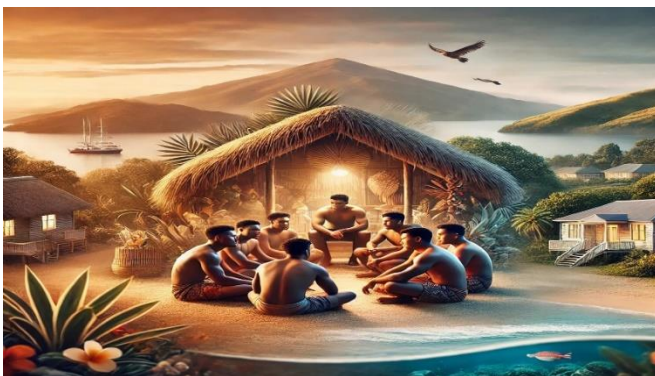

This research identifies and maps Māori Customary Land parcels, highlighting discrepancies between legal recognition and cadastral representation, and emphasizes the need for culturally responsive mapping and improved data integration to protect indigenous land rights in Aotearoa.
