Investigations into organ harvesting in China. Hon David Kilgour, Canada

Former Canadian Cabinet Minister, the Hon David Kilgour (along with David Matas and Ethan Gutmann), recently released new research suggesting that forced organ harvesting in China has been much more widespread than previously thought. They conclude that the number of transplants, at least 60,000 a year, far exceeds official figures and, most significantly, the number of legitimate donors. Hon Kilgour states “It is possible that over 1 million innocent people may have been murdered for their organs since the year 2000”.



David Kilgour was a Canadian MP for 27 years. He won the 2009 Human Rights Award from the International Society for Human Rights. In 2010, he was nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize for investigating organ harvesting crimes in China. David graduated from the University of Manitoba in economics and the University of Toronto law school.
