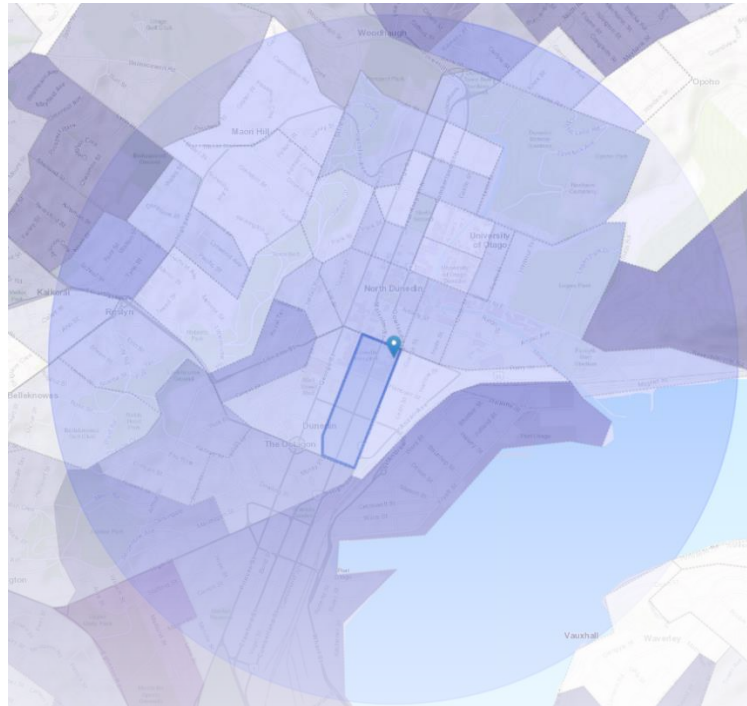

Developing customised sociodemographic profiles to support community advocacy

The spatial and temporal availability of alcohol is a key determinant of alcohol use and related harm. Ensuring community input into local alcohol licensing decisions is vital and can be supported by online tools that provide alcohol harm risk information for local areas. Using the Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD), NZDep, the Census and other geospatial data, this presentation describes the development of an automated alcohol reporting tool that integrates numerous secondary data sources related to alcohol-related risks close proximity to alcohol premises. A second tool designed to explore inequities in alcohol-outlet density in Auckland will also be discussed.
