Philip Nel is Professor Emeritus at the University of Otago. A leading scholar in political economy and global inequality, he has taught and researched across New Zealand, South Africa, Germany, Japan, and Vietnam, and supervised more than 30 PhD students. He is the author of *The Politics of Economic Inequality in Developing Countries* and numerous works on international relations and development.

About the lecture:

Despite major progress in reducing global poverty and inequality, where a child is born still powerfully determines their chances of survival. Professor Nel explores how national borders shape life chances, the role of multilateral cooperation in addressing inequality, and what countries like Aotearoa New Zealand can do to keep global progress alive.
