





Located across Clyde Street from the central buildings of University College, the Forth Street Mews provides a unique living situation offering the best of collegiate life while promoting a strong subcommunity within the wider UniCol environment.

The 60 residents of the Mews are supported by one of UniCol's live-in Resident Tutors and two members of the residential assistant team. The Mews Resident Tutor is the academic mentor for all Mews residents. These three staff members foster a supportive and inclusive community.

There are twelve "houses" in the Mews complex. Each house has five fully-furnished bedrooms, bathroom and laundry facilities, a lounge and a kitchenette.

"Mewsies" are fully-fledged members of the UniCol community. They eat in the Refectory, use all the facilities, visit friends in other buildings, entertain guests at the Mews, attend academic tutorials and participate in all collegiate activities. For intra-collegiate competitions, excursions and floor missions, the Mews are divided into two "floors" of 30 residents each.

As well as enjoying their own houses, Mews residents have access to the Mews community centre, *"Te Whare Iti",* with a comfortable lounge, a fully-equipped kitchen where residents may practice their culinary skills, a BBQ area and small seminar rooms.

While residents may eat breakfast in the Refectory, breakfast supplies are also delivered weekly to each Mews house to allow more flexibility. Where possible and practical, Mews residents have the opportunity to live in an alcohol-free house, a male or female-only house or a house where everyone studies the same academic programme.

Mewsies have a strong history of being great University Collegians. They feature prominently in academic achievement, sports teams, competition winners and music and cultural participation.
