

Advice for offering a University of Otago programme in a language other than English or Māori

While the expectation is that English and Māori are the usual languages for teaching, examination, and administration at the University of Otago, there may be occasions when delivering a programme in another language will be considered. A programme offered in a language other than English or Māori will normally only be offered to students outside of New Zealand, by distance, and be delivered by Otago staff.

Normally each language that the programme will be offered in requires a separate schedule and separate paper codes, established via the Academic Approval Process.

Before progressing with the development of a programme that would be delivered in a language other than English and Māori there are a number of factors which should be considered. As such, you are required to consult with:

- the relevant Divisional Associate Dean (Academic for undergraduate programmes / Postgraduate for postgraduate programmes)
- Academic Committees and Services
- the International Office
