Top 10(ish) Tips

Developing Research with Māori

 Identify the potential contribution of your research to Māori health
(i.e. how will you help to transform the landscape)

 Identify the broader context in which your research will be taking place.

 Check the website and remember that Google is your friend.

 Building an expert Māori whānau is a long term project (but you can't do without one)

 Elizabeth will do the introduction, but you have to do the courting and pop the question.

 You need to get marketing savvy and sell the research – what is in for the community

 Be prepared to apply a range of recruitment methods – including some kanohi ki te kanohi

 Make it easy for Māori to participate (and to come back)

Tip 9 Ensure consent is fully informed

Disseminate to participants/community first

 Research is an ongoing relationship, not just a hit and run raid

 Dissemination is more than papers and preaching – community resources and indirect inputs

Avoid solely deficit model in analysis and write up

Encouragement

 Try incorporating Māori cultural recommendations, it will be easier than you think.

Extra Tip

 Be careful about getting participant's iwi right!
