Introduction

It is now eleven months since New Zealand was deeply shocked by a terror attack by a white supremacist at two Christchurch mosques, which killed 51 people. In the aftermath of this atrocity, Jacinda Ardern's Labour-New Zealand First coalition took a number of security measures including the swift banning of automatic weapons, the tighter regulation of foreign donations to New Zealand political parties, and an international initiative, known as the Christchurch Call, to curb online extremism. The question that lingers, however, is whether such measures are sufficient to help New Zealand adapt to a post-Christchurch security environment.

The focus of this School is on New Zealand National Security and the Post-Christchurch Era. A core issue examined here concerns the country's national security requirements before and after the Christchurch terror attacks. To explore this question, the School focuses on a number of interrelated themes. These include:

- The Global Security Context of New Zealand
- Identity, Racism and the Rise of Far-Right White Terrorism
- The Growth of Online Extremism
- The Challenge of Countering and Reversing Terrorism
- The Increase of Transnational Organised Crime
- The Security Challenges Presented by the Pacific Region
