Exploring the effectiveness of the land-use plan in delivering intensification outcomes in Auckland

Urban growth policies that promote housing intensification and higher density development have been widely embraced in development strategies of many cities in New Zealand, Australia, parts of Europe, and the Pacific Northwest. The Auckland Council also seeks to implement a compact city model, aiming to encourage most of its future growth and developments in and around existing and proposed town centres and transit nodes, with the goal of achieving a liveable city. However, the uncertainty around what the future might hold in reality, and whether the plan tools can facilitate the realisation of the anticipated outcomes, remain one of the significant challenges faced by both policy makers and practitioners. Drawing on the Auckland experience, this talk will explore and discuss the land-use plan tools, approaches and policies in delivering the desired intensification outcomes.
