Context

This strategy sets the direction and focus for the library to 2028, in the context of the University Vision 2040, Pae Tata: Strategic Plan to 2030, the Māori Strategic Framework, Pacific Strategic Framework, and Sustainability Framework. The library contributes to the success of diverse communities including students, researchers, academic and professional staff as well as the public, with priority for members of identified equity groups. A key marker of success is how we respond to the aspirations of Māori and Pacific communities, inside and outside the University. The use of the word 'scholarship' is intended to be inclusive of all study, learning, teaching, and research by all diverse communities. The University Values and Library Guiding Principles influence all aspects of library activity and are touch points to regularly revisit. The Strategic Themes determine the focus for library service developments and guide the content of the rolling two-year detailed implementation plan. Each individual colleague is connected to the operational plan through their Performance and Development Review objectives. Two supporting tactical strategies ensure digital and high-quality customer experience are ubiquitous.
