4. Plan for C4 moving ahead

- a. Administrative matters: Website; Branding, labelling; Directory
 - Bridget suggested that with the new UOC building virtually on-hold that branding ourselves where we are each based now might be a solution. Bridget and Alice will meet to discuss further and design something with our logo which people could display on their doors or in lab spaces.
 - John wondered if C4 members should be using the C4 as an affiliation on manuscripts and grant applications. It was agreed that Bridget will draft a letter to C4 members to propose this idea to see what the response is. Bridget will then run it by the Dean, Peter Joyce.
 - The Patient Information page of links will be added to the website.
- b. Involvement in planning for re-development of CDHB and UOC campuses
 - Bridget summarised the main points of the C4 meeting held on 4 April to specifically discuss Ian Town's proposal for a Cancer Centre of Excellence.
 - Bridget attended a meeting with Liz Chesterman, Helen McCleod, Sheila
 McBreen-Kerr, Ian Town and Kate Reid. Bridget and Liz expressed that the cost of
 rent in a new building in the Health Precinct area is out of reach for NGOs. They
 proposed that a building could have areas many different groups could use, for
 displays, lectures and be a shared referral point for NGOs. There was some

- discussion at the meeting about possible uses for the building it could be used for clinical trials or for bioengineering and biophysics.
- Bridget also attended a meeting with Catherine Mohr and Murray Brennan at Wigram with the CCDU. Again, Bridget expressed that the cost of rent is impossible for community groups.
- Logan attended a Health Research meeting which included representatives from UOC, Canterbury University, Lincoln University and the CDHB. Logan reported that this was a brainstorming session. The outcome of all the ideas is unknown at this stage.
- The C4 needs to keep advocating for what is good for the community in the Health Precinct.
- It was suggested that perhaps Government funding could help NGOs have a presence in the Health Precinct.

c. C4 Newsletter

- It was agreed that the next newsletter be made available to the public as well as C4 members. It will be put on our website, posted to the Healthy News website.
- Suggestions for the next newsletter were: publicise the upcoming C4 Public Open Day, Oncology Outreach Nurses, the new exercise programme, the green prescriptions.

 - Ants noted how hard it can be to get men in his support group to exercise and to evaluate how to better look after their general health.
