Purpose

To outline the policy for photographing and filming in the Hocken gallery by visitors.

Content

- Photography and filming in the Hocken Exhibition Gallery and foyer displays is allowed for personal, non-commercial purposes only. No photographs or videos may be reproduced, distributed, or sold without permission from the Hocken Librarian.
- Close-ups of any artwork or object, or photography of artworks/objects displaying the “no photography” sign is prohibited. In some exhibitions, photography, filming, and videoing are completely prohibited. A sign at the exhibition entrance will make this clear.
- The use of tripods, flash or other means of artificial lighting is prohibited. Check with one of our staff if in doubt.
- The Hocken reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to withhold and/or withdraw permission to photograph on its premises or to reproduce photographs of objects in our collection, or in our care.
- Unauthorised *commercial* publications or reproduction of any part of the Hocken’s Collection, or work on temporary loan to the Hocken is prohibited and in breach of the Copyright Act.
- We will not be liable for unauthorised photography by our visitors.
