Never Say Lecture Again & Licence to Swill

For the Christmas seminar we are covering two issues of vital importance to public health, thanks to Caroline Shaw, Amanda D'Souza and Nick Wilson.

First up in "Never Say Lecture Again" we review the experience of the first year of a radical new approach to teaching public health to undergraduate medical students. Teaching staff involved in designing the new module, students who experienced the module, staff who taught the module for the first time and former MP Tim Barnett who leads one of the sessions will share the results of the year and their reflections on the experience.

In the second half, Professor Nick Wilson will discuss "Licence to Swill: Drinking by James Bond over Six Decades (along with trend analyses of his smoking, head injuries and unsafe sex). Come and learn about what hazardous activities Bond does after excessive drinking and when his estimated blood alcohol reaches lethal levels. Also when did he quit smoking and what is his chronic exposure to second-hand smoke from his sexual partners? Has he stopped using head butts to subdue opponents and has he ever indicated any awareness of what safe sex is?
