




## FIRST NZ CAPITAL SCHOLARSHIP FOR STUDIES IN FINANCE

Established in 2003 by First NZ Capital, one of New Zealand's leading investment banks offering a full range of services including investment banking, retail investor services, equity and fixed interest sales and trading, and equity and economic research.

1. One Scholarship shall be awarded annually to a student whose full-time course of study in the year of tenure includes one or more of 300-level or 400 level papers in Commerce or another approved course.
2. The Scholarship shall be awarded by the University Council to the applicant who is recommended for the award by a Selection Committee, comprising the Head of the Department of Finance and Quantitative Analysis and a representative of First NZ Capital.
3. In making its recommendation, the Selection Committee shall give regard to applicants' academic record, communication skills, leadership potential and prospects for making a contribution to the finance profession in New Zealand.
4. The holding of another Scholarship shall not exclude a student from holding this Scholarship, but the Scholar may not be in employment for more than 15 hours per week.
5. The Scholarship shall be tenable for one year at an emolument of \$2,000 or such sum as shall be determined by the donors.
6. The University Council may at any time terminate the Scholarship if the scholar ceases to follow satisfactorily the programme described in clause one of these regulations.
7. Applications for the Scholarship close with the Undergraduate Scholarships Officer on 23 March.
