The other great thing is as Irish students mainly go home for the weekends you are more than likely to get at least a four if not three day weekend.

The University grounds are beautiful, modern and have eight km of walking and running tracks, a stadium, two gyms, pool complex and even lakes. The exchange team are extremely supportive and accessible if you should need assistance as well as organising fun events.

One thing I would say is that Ireland is expensive (Particularly if the dollar crashed while you're away), so be prepared for that before you leave.
