  - i. Postgraduate Diploma in Obstetrics and Medical Gynaecology (PGDipOMG): Maximum 40 places
  - ii. Postgraduate Certificate in Women's Health (PGCertWHlth) Maximum 20 places if PGDipOMG full
- 3. Candidates for the PGDipOMG must have secured a minimum 26 week hospital position in obstetrics and gynaecology in New Zealand.
