

## Connecting to UO\_WIFI: Linux Ubuntu 12.04

### What is UO\_WIFI?

UO\_WIFI is the wireless network available to staff, students, and contractors to use when on University of Otago sites. Those with laptops and wireless capable devices can connect to UO\_WIFI to access both internal University resources and the internet. Your level of access is determined from your username.

### Connecting to UO\_WIFI

1. Click the **Network Manager** icon (wireless fan) in your menu bar. Choose the network you wish to connect to. For the new network, this is **UO\_WIFI**.

*Some areas of campus may still see older/legacy networks called UO-STAFF, UO-STUDENT, UO-EXTERNAL or UO-GUEST – do not connect to these and instead use UO\_WIFI.*

2. In the **Wireless Network Authentication Required** window check that:  
Wireless security – **WPA & WPA2 Enterprise**  
Authentication – **Protected EAP (PEAP)**  
PEAP version – **Automatic**  
Inner authentication – **MSCHAPv2**
3. Enter your University of Otago username and password. Click **Connect**.



4. Disable mutual authentication by checking **Don't warn me again** and clicking **Ignore**.



You are now connected.

Test your connection by opening your web browser and going to a University of Otago website and an external website, for example to <https://www.otago.ac.nz> and <https://www.bbc.co.uk>
