


Connecting to UO_WIFI: Linux (Ubuntu 22.04)

What is UO_WIFI?

UO_WIFI is the wireless network available to staff, students, and contractors to use when on University of Otago Sites. Those with laptops and wireless capable devices can connect to UO_WIFI to access both internal University resources and the internet. Your level of access is determined from your username

Connecting to UO_WIFI


1. Click on the **system tray** in the top right corner.



2. Select **Wi-Fi Not Connected** then click on **Select Network**.



3. Select **UO_WIFI** then click on **Connect**.








4. In the Wi-Fi Network Authentication Required window check that: Wi-Fi Security: WPA & WPA2 Enterprise Authentication: Protected EAP (PEAP) Tick the box for No CA certificate is required

PEAP version: Automatic

Inner authentication: MSCHAPv2

5. Enter your University of Otago username and password. Click **Connect**.



You should now be connected.
