

Connecting to UO_WIFI: Mac OS X

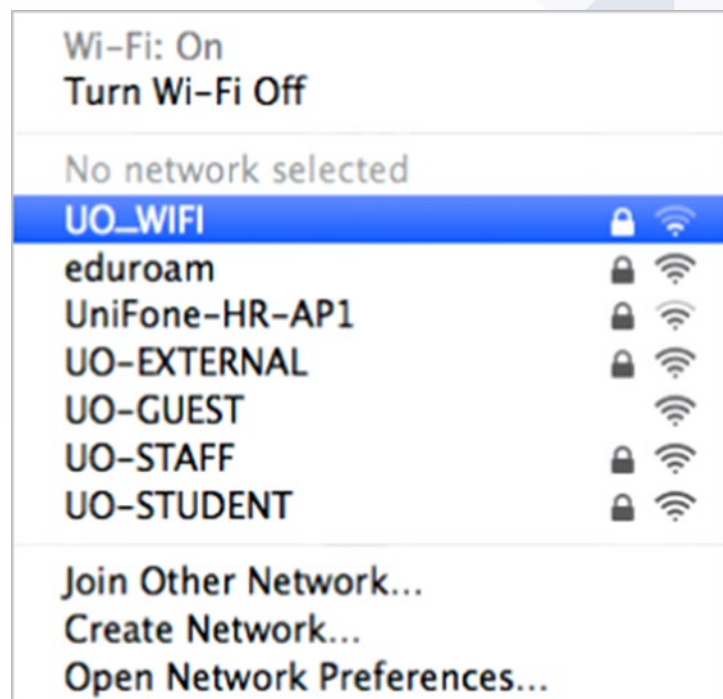
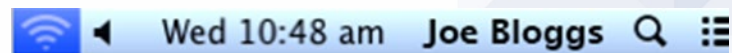
What is UO_WIFI?

UO_WIFI is the wireless network available to staff, students, and contractors to use when on University of Otago sites. Those with laptops and wireless capable devices can connect to UO_WIFI to access both internal University resources and the internet. Your level of access is determined from your username.

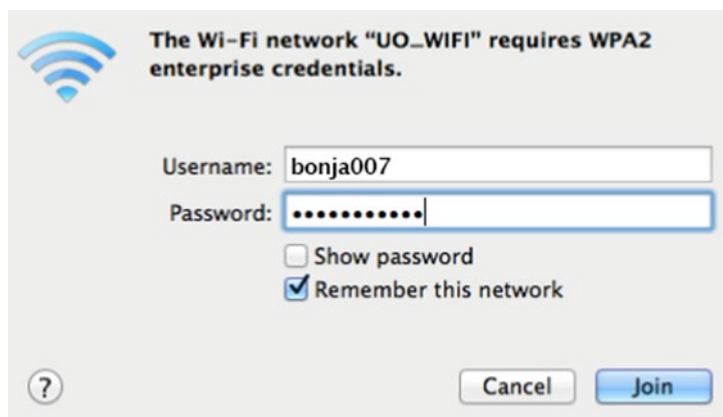
Connecting to UO_WIFI

1. Click the Wi-Fi symbol by the clock on your Menu bar.
2. Check that the Wi-Fi is turned on and then select the University network **UO_WIFI**.

Some areas of campus may still see older/legacy networks called UO-STAFF, UO-STUDENT, UO-EXTERNAL or UO-GUEST – do not connect to these and instead use UO_WIFI.



3. Enter your **University username and password** and click **Join**.



4. If you are asked to Verify Certificate, click **Continue**. Enter your **computer's password** if you are prompted for it.



You are now connected.

Test your connection by opening your web browser and going to a University of Otago website and an external website, for example to <https://www.otago.ac.nz> and <https://www.bbc.co.uk>
