

## Connecting to UO\_WIFI: Android

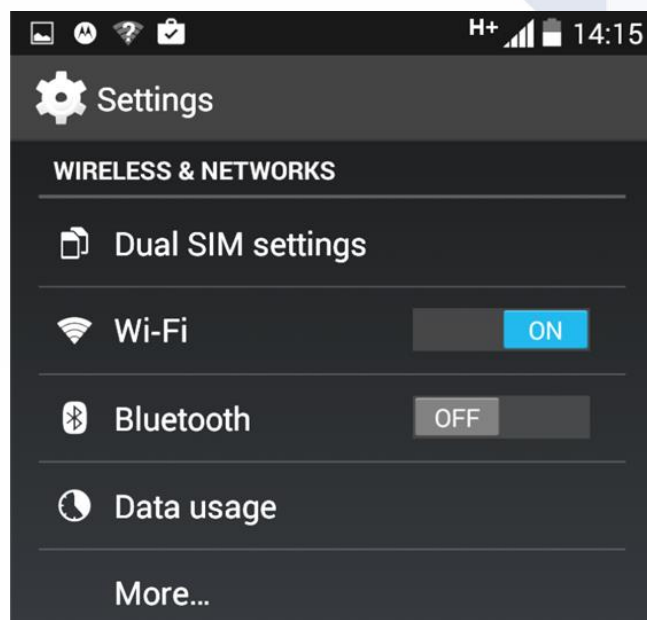
### What is UO\_WIFI?

UO\_WIFI is the wireless network available to staff, students, and contractors to use when on University of Otago sites. Those with laptops and wireless capable devices can connect to UO\_WIFI to access both internal University resources and the internet. Your level of access is determined from your username.

### Connecting to UO\_WIFI

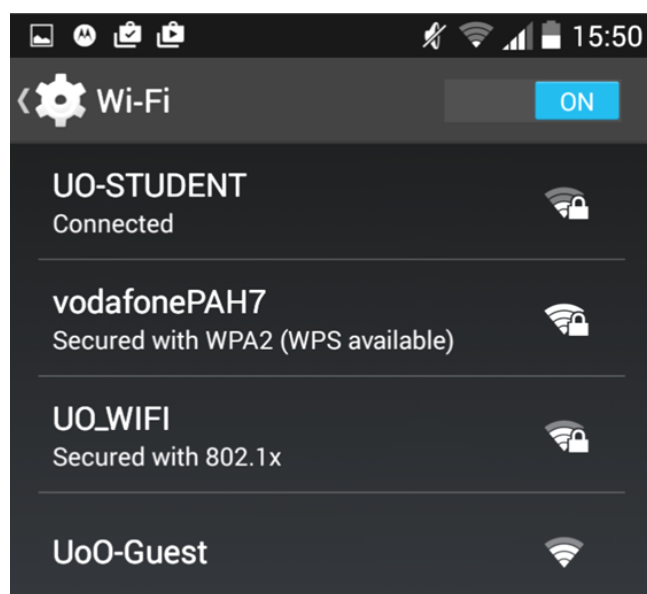
*Please note: Android phones can vary slightly between each manufacturer. The guide below covers the settings that need to be applied but these may look different to the images i.e. on some phones, you will need to click Advanced to see the EAP settings.*

1. Go to the **Settings** menu and select **Wi-Fi**.



2. Check that the wireless is turned on, and select the University network **UO\_WIFI**.

*Some areas of campus may still see older/legacy networks called UO-STAFF, UO-STUDENT, UO-EXTERNAL or UO-GUEST – do not connect to these and instead use UO\_WIFI*



3. Enter your University username in the **Identity** field

Enter your University password in the **Password** field

Do not enter anything into the **Anonymous identity** field

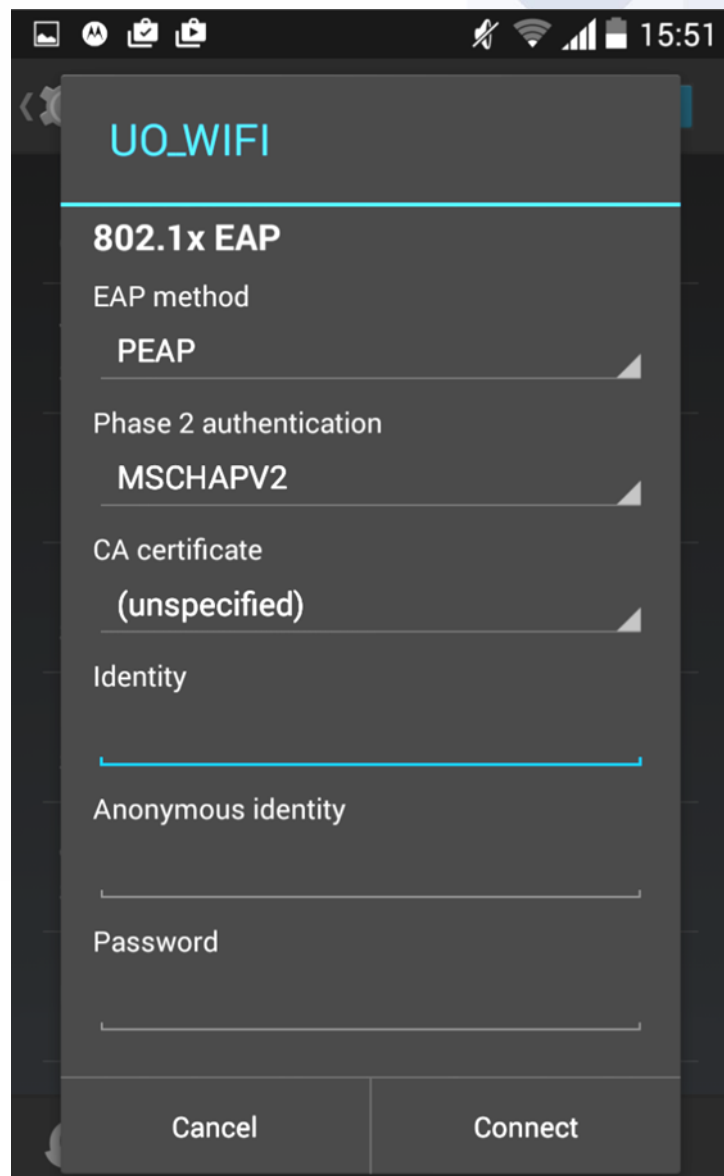
**EAP method:** PEAP

**Phase 2 authentication:** MSCHAPV2

**CA Certificate:** 'Unspecified' or 'Don't validate'.

**MAC Address Type:** Use device MAC (available on Android 8.0 or later)

4. Tap **Connect**.
