

Connecting to UO_WIFI: Linux Ubuntu 12.04

What is UO_WIFI?

The University of Otago network is being upgraded, and UO_WIFI is the name of the new wireless network. The older networks (e.g., UO-STUDENT, UO-STAFF) will remain while the new network is being rolled out. Your device will switch between them if it has connected in the past.

Connecting to UO_WIFI

1. Click the **Network Manager** icon (wireless fan) in your menu bar. Choose the network you wish to connect to. For the new network, this is **UO_WIFI**.
2. In the **Wireless Network Authentication Required** window check that:
 Wireless security – **WPA & WPA2 Enterprise**
 Authentication – **Protected EAP (PEAP)**
 PEAP version – **Automatic**
 Inner authentication – **MSCHAPv2**
3. Enter your University of Otago username and password. Click **Connect**.
4. Disable mutual authentication by checking **Don't warn me again** and clicking **Ignore**.



You are now connected.

Test your connection by opening your web browser and going to a University of Otago website and an external website, for example to <http://www.otago.ac.nz> and <http://www.bbc.com>
