

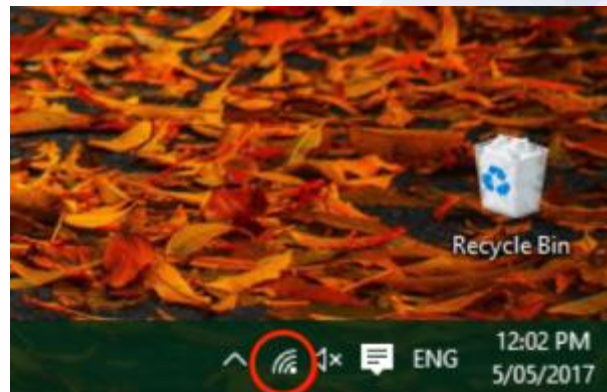
Connecting to UO_WIFI: Windows 10

What is UO_WIFI?

UO_WIFI is the wireless network available to staff, students, and contractors to use when on University of Otago sites. Those with laptops and wireless capable devices can connect to UO_WIFI to access both internal University resources and the internet. Your level of access is determined from your username.

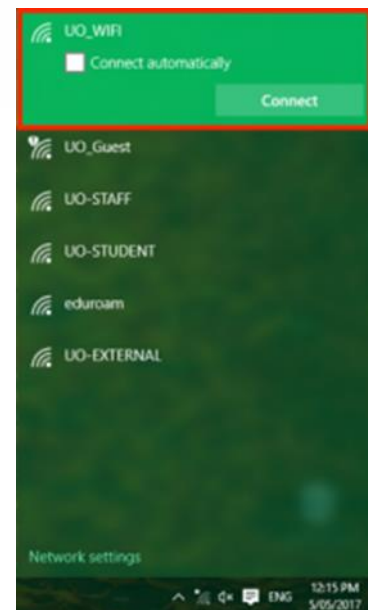
Connecting to UO_WIFI

1. Click on the **Network** icon located in the taskbar (near the clock at the lower right-hand side), and a box will pop up showing a list of available wireless network connections.

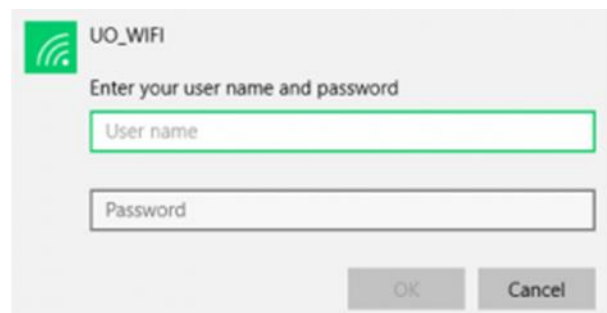


2. Select **UO_WIFI** and click **Connect**, leaving the **Connect Automatically** box ticked.

Some areas of campus may still see older/legacy networks called UO-STAFF, UO-STUDENT, UO-EXTERNAL or UO-GUEST – do not connect to these and instead use UO_WIFI



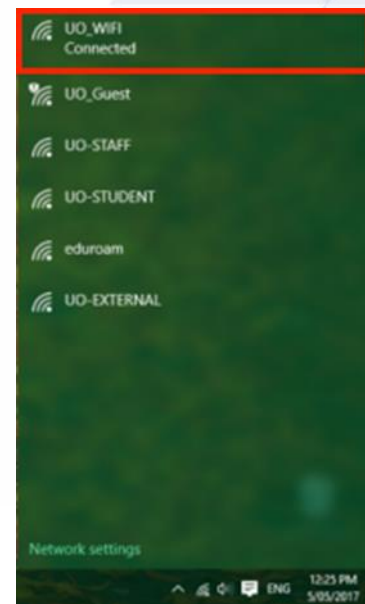
3. A **Network Authentication** prompt box will appear. Enter your University username (e.g. bonja22p) and associated password and click **OK**.



4. If prompted to **Continue connecting?**
Click **Connect**.



5. You should now be connected to the UO_WIFI wireless network.
