



2012 DOCTORAL SCHOLARSHIPS

INFORMATION AND GUIDELINES FOR APPLICANTS

Purpose: To provide support for doctoral study in the area of Indigenous Development Research and develop excellent research capabilities to deliver research in two specific areas:

1. Fostering Te Pā Harakeke – understanding, achieving and maintaining ‘healthy and prosperous families of mana’ and the lessons this may hold for New Zealand families overall. Understanding what ‘Te Pā Harakeke’ is, enabling it to be achieved and addressing the barriers.
2. Sustaining Māori Distinctiveness – understanding and yielding the distinctive contribution that Māori peoples make and may yet make to New Zealand society, culture, economy and overall prosperity. What positive and unique Māori contributions to New Zealand’s national development do and could exist?

Eligibility: For Māori or indigenous students who are currently enrolled or in the process of enrolling in a recognised doctoral programme of study and research at a tertiary institution. Applicants must not work more than 10 hours per week in paid employment while in receipt of this scholarship.

Scholarships offered: Ngā Pae o te Māramatanga will award three Doctoral Scholarships

Tenure: The period is normally up to three years

Value: the value of the award will be \$25,000 plus course fees per year; and thesis binding.

Applications: Open 01 August 2011 and close 30 September 2011 for a January 2012 start

Applicants should allow a minimum of one month for the application selection process to take place after closing. Applicants will be notified of the outcome at the earliest opportunity.
