

Health Research Excellence Awards 2019

Research Support Person Award

This award is to acknowledge the excellent support provided by general staff to research groups, units and departments within both Southern District Health Board and the Dunedin School of Medicine. Application for this award should be made by the research team leader.

The successful applicant will receive up to \$3,000 for travel to a specified conference, or other appropriate travel.

To be eligible for this award the staff member must be a general staff member of the Dunedin School of Medicine or working in a research support role in the Southern District Health Board

Applications should be made by the research team leader in the form of a one page letter outlining:

- the benefit of the staff member to the team's research
- a copy of the staff member's CV
- the potential benefit to the team to be gained from the conference (or other) attendance
- details of the conference (or other) including name dates and location
- an indication of the costs of the conference (or other)

Please note: all applications should be sent in electronic form, along with one original hard copy (A4, no staples).

Applications will be assessed on the following criteria:

- the benefit of the staff member to the team's research
- the potential benefit to the team to be gained from the conference (or other) attendance
- the overall contribution to DSM/SDHB research

The applications will be assessed by a panel appointed by Health Research South.
