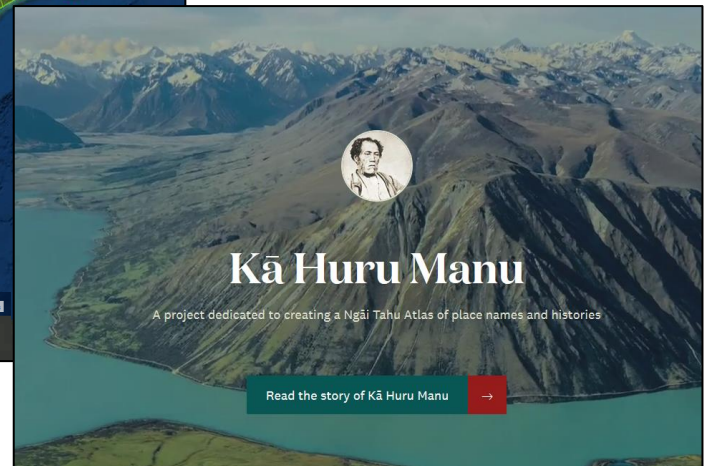
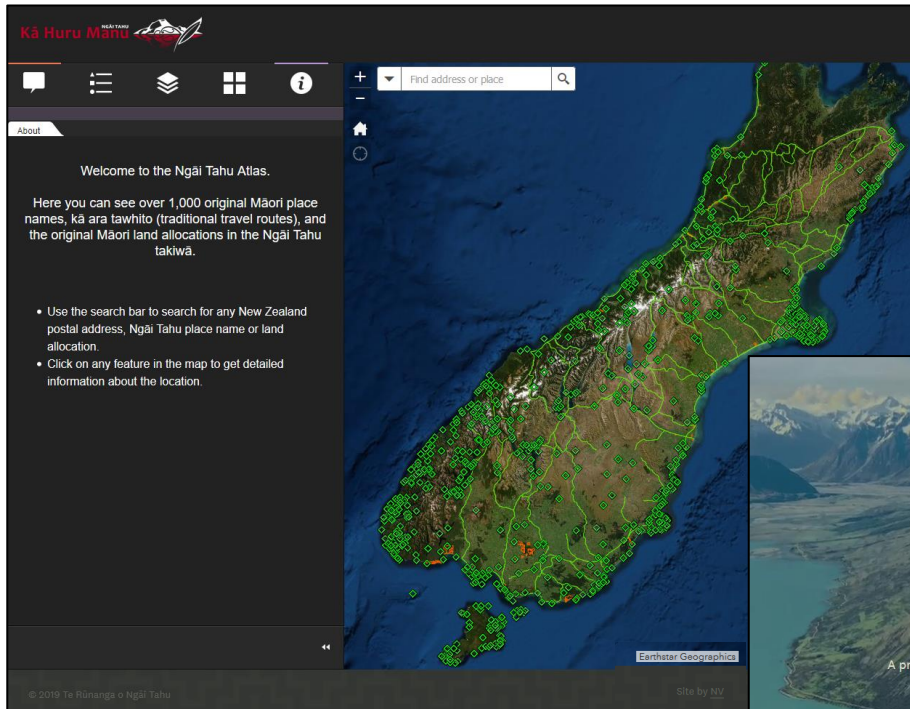


Kā Huru Manu: My names are the treasured cloak which adorns the land

Abstract:

Kā Huru Manu is an iwi-driven project that brings Ngāi Tahu history to life. In 2017 Ngāi Tahu launched Kā Huru Manu (www.kahurumanu.co.nz), an online digital atlas that features over 1000 traditional Māori place names, a selection of ara tawhito (traditional travel routes), and historical Māori land allocations (Native Reserves) within the Ngāi Tahu rohe (tribal area). The visually striking website also tells the story behind the project and celebrates the people involved with its development. Kā Huru Manu uses the latest Geographical Information System technology to record and map Ngāi Tahu stories on a virtual landscape for future generations. The bulk of the research was completed by Ngāi Tahu marae communities, kaumātua and Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu staff over 10 years of wānanga, hui, and field trips. Administered by the Ngāi Tahu Archive Team alongside the 18 Ngāi Tahu Papatipu Rūnanga, Kā Huru Manu is fast becoming the authoritative source of Ngāi Tahu place names and histories in Te Waipounamu.
